Dear Parents,

We are really excited to introduce a new program for your child's school! Mad Science of St. Louis is sponsoring a cell phone recycling program where your child has the opportunity to participate and help their school earn free Mad Science programming by collecting old cell phones. Staying true to our curriculum, we are launching a recycling cell phone fund raiser program. There are roughly 130 million cell phones thrown into landfills each year. Each phone contains toxic materials including arsenic, lead and zinc that should be properly disposed of as well as precious metals and plastics that can be recycled and reused.

In order to earn a free assembly for your school, your child can help by asking friends, your coworkers, members of organizations you belong to, and neighbors to donate as many used cell phones as possible until XXXX, 2011.
